
Mission & Vision

Who We Are

Together, the Consortium's 19 districts span 12 states from Washington to Florida, include 8 of the largest 25 school districts in the nation, enroll an average of more than 98,000 students, and educate a total of 1.9 million students. Members' growing and increasingly diverse student bodies reflect communities across America, with 63% students of color and 40% qualifying for free or reduced-cost


